**Community Committee Tuesday 17 September.** The committee discussed: the timetable for choosing three new charities. It was agreed that to wait for the arrival of Canon Maggie, the new Canon Missioner, as she will be working closely with the Social Action Group. In the meantime, as we have formally coming to the end of our two-year support of our three charities, York Neighbours, Home Start and Embrace, it was agreed that we would give each of them a Christmas/Harvest gift. It was also agreed to make a £500 donation to YES Project Zero. This would still leave a quarter of the funds available as a contingency. The committee discussed the need to continue with regular coffee mornings. There was a detailed report and paper about the Cathedral Growth Group Gathering and discussion. Terms of reference for the group have been prepared. The committee discussed the residents' weekend, 25 – 26 January 2020, and the Come and See Mission, 12 – 15 March 2020. The 1400<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations take place in 2027. It was agreed there should be representation from the community committee on the organising committee. The next meeting of the Community Committee is on Wednesday 6 November.
